



The Willard A. Peterson & Winifred W. Peterson Memorial Scholarship

The Willard A. Peterson & Winifred W. Peterson Memorial Scholarship of First Congregational United Church of Christ, Moline, Illinois (FCC) is to provide tuition assistance for church members who are seeking private or public post-secondary education.

Scholarships will be awarded to applicants for the 2019-2020 academic year. Qualified expenses that may be covered with this scholarship's award are tuition and mandatory academic expenses required for enrollment (no book, supply charges, or room and board expenses qualify).

Applicants for the Peterson Memorial Scholarship must meet the following criteria:

- Active, participating member of First Congregational United Church of Christ, Moline, Illinois
- High school or college graduate, or earned a G.E.D
- Achieved a GPA of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Enrolled (or will be at the time scholarships are distributed) in a regionally accredited institution of higher learning, either part-time or full-time, pursuing certification, Bachelor's degree, Master's degree or Doctorate

The Peterson Memorial Scholarship is a one-year scholarship. Church members must apply annually.

Each semester's funds will be paid from FCC directly without exception to the college or university upon receipt of institutional statements of enrollment.

DEADLINE is March 22, 2019. The following items must be **postmarked or delivered** by March 22, 2019:

- Complete application in ink, not pencil. (**Please be sure all *five* sections are completed.**)
- Include a picture of yourself for future press release. (**Must be a .pdf file sent to carol.freeman@fccmoline.org.**)
- Include official grade transcripts from current school. If the applicant has been out of school for more than five (5) years, most recent grade transcripts will be accepted.
- Church Activity Reflections (see last page of the application)
- Two letters of reference from the following:
 - One letter of recommendation must be from a non-related, non-staff, current member of First Congregational Church and must attest to the applicant's character and church participation
 - One letter of recommendation must be from another non-related person (i.e. teacher, counselor, mentor, etc.) and must attest to the applicant's character and academic potential.
 - It is your responsibility to make sure that letters of recommendation are received in the church office by March 22nd, 2019.
 - Prior submitted recommendations will not be accepted.
 - Prior applications for this scholarship will not be accepted.
